

HEMP PERMIT: CONDITIONS FOR EXPORT OF HEMP PROPAGATING MATERIAL (LOW THC CANNABIS)

- 1. The permit holder is responsible for supervision and monitoring of the activities conducted under this permit.
- 2. All hemp material must relate to registered varieties or if not registered, authorised varieties / breeding lines with the relevant authorizations.
- 3. All propagating material must be of certified or approved status by the relevant authority (SANSOR, DALRRD:PP or Breeder of material)
- 4. The permit holder must obtain an import permit from his client in the country he wants to export to, prior to applying for the required phytosanitary and export certificates.
- 5. The permit holder must ensure all consignments leaving his/her premises, are accompanied by the following documentation:
 - a. Transport declaration
 - b. Detailed invoice and/or packing list
 - c. Copy of hemp permit of the permit holder for export
 - d. Copy of analytical report(s) relating to the consignment
 - e. PIA Export certificate
 - f. Phytosanitary certificate
- Detail records must be kept (logbook) of all activities relating to export of hemp propagating material, including all inspections conducted. The records/logbook must be available for inspection by the authorized inspector.

- 7. Authorized inspectors must be allowed access to conduct inspection of the premises and facilities or any activity relating to hemp.
- 8. The permit holder must submit an annual report on the activities conducted under his/her permit to the Registrar by 30 June every year.
- 9. Non-compliance with any of the permit conditions may lead to actions taken against the holder of the permit in terms of section 35 of the PIA.
