AGRICULTURAL PESTS ACT, 1983 (ACT NO. 36 OF 1983)

CONTROL MEASURES, AS AMENDED

I, Angela Thokozile Didiza, Minister of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development, acting under section 6 of the Agricultural Pests Act, 1983 (Act No. 36 of 1983), hereby prescribe the control measures set out in the Schedule in order to prevent and combat the spreading of pathogens, insects and exotic animals.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

In this Schedule "the Control Measures" means the control measures published in Government Notice No. R. 110 of 27 January 1984, as amended by Government Notices Nos.  In this notice any word or phrase to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act and Regulations made there under shall have that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates-

"**authority**" means any officer of the Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development in the national, provincial or local sphere of government;

"demarcated quarantine area" means an area determined by order under Section 7 of the Act or specified in terms of the control measures within which a quarantine pest is present and is being officially controlled;

"**Inspection**" means an official visual examination of plants, plant products or other regulated articles to determine if pests are present or to determine compliance with phytosanitary regulations;

"land" means any premises in terms of ownership or user and includes planted crops at a place of production, natural resources, ports of entry, buildings, structures and any area within the Republic;

"**nursery**" means a business where plants or propagating material is propagated and grown for sale, and which is registered in terms of the Plant Improvement Act, 2018 (Act No. 11 of 2018);

"**pest**" means any species, strain or biotype of plant, animal or pathogenic agent injurious to plants or plant products;

"phytosanitary procedure" means any official method for implementing phytosanitary measures including the performance of inspections, tests, surveillance or treatments in connection with regulated pests; "quarantine pest" means any pest of potential economic importance to the area endangered thereby and not yet present there, or present but not yet widely distributed and being officially controlled;

"regulated article" means any plant, plant product, storage place, packaging, conveyance, container, soil and any other organism, object or material capable of harbouring or spreading pests, deemed to require phytosanitary measures, particularly where international transportation is involved;

"regulated pest" means a quarantine pest or a regulated non-quarantine pest;

"**test**" means official examination, other than visual, to determine if pests are present or to identify pests;

"the Act" means the Agricultural Pests Act, 1983 (Act No. 36 of 1983); and

"visual examination" means the physical examination of plant products, or other regulated articles using the unaided eye, lens, stereoscope or microscope to detect pests or contaminants without testing or processing.

Prohibition relating to the occurrence and removal of certain regulated pests

2. (1) No user of land who is the owner or occupier of a nursery shall-

(a) keep any regulated pests specified in Table 1 on the premises of such nursery;(b) keep, plant or cultivate any plant on the premises of such nursery unless such plant is-

- i. visual examined of the regulated pests specified in Table 1; and
- ii. tested free from the regulated pests specified Table 1.

(c) keep any infectious thing on the premises of such nursery unless such infectious thing is free from the regulated pests specified in Table 1.

(2) No user of land shall remove any plant from any land within the Republic to any other land within the Republic unless such plant is-

(a) visually examined, tested free and or found to be free from the regulated pests specified in Table 1.

(3) No user of land shall remove any infectious thing from any land within the Republic to any other land within the Republic unless such infectious thing is free from the regulated pests specified in Table 1.

(4) No user of land shall remove any plant or plant product that are-

(a) infested or infected by the regulated pests specified in Table 1 from any land where regulated pests specified in Table 1 occurs;

(b) suspected to be infested or infected by the regulated pests specified in Table 1 from any land where the regulated pests specified in Table 1 occur or suspected to occur;

(c) from any area within the Republic demarcated or quarantined by the authority where the regulated pests specified in Table 1 occur, unless the movement is authorised by means of a permit by the authority to certify free from the regulated pests specified in Table 1;

(d) from any demarcated quarantine area within the Republic without authorization.

Prohibition relating to keeping, planting or cultivation of certain plants

- 3. (1) No user of land shall keep, plant or cultivate any plant of a kind specified in column1 of Table 2 on any land within the area specified in column 2 of the said Table opposite the name of the kind of plant concerned.
 - (2) No user of land shall keep, plant or cultivate any sugar-cane plant (*Saccharum officinarum*) in the Republic without the authorisation of the permit referred to in section 6 (3)(b) of the Act, excluding the varieties indicated in Table 3.
 - (3) No user of land shall keep, plant or cultivate any plant of a kind specified in column 1 of Table 4 originating from any land within an area specified in column 2 of the said Table opposite the name of the kind of plant concerned on any land within an area indicated in column 3 of the said table opposite the name of the kind of plant concerned.
 - (4) No user of land shall remove, keep, plant or cultivate any plant of a kind specified in column 1 of Table 7 originating from any land within an area specified in column 2 of the said Table on any land within an area indicated in column 3 of the said Table.

Prohibition relating to the removal of certain plants

- 4. (1) No user of land shall remove any plant of a kind specified in column 1 of Table 4 from any land within the area specified in column 2 of the said Table opposite the name of the kind of plant concerned to any land within the area specified in column 3 of the said Table opposite the name of the kind of plant concerned.
- (2) No user of land shall remove any plant of a kind specified in column 1 of Table 5 from any land within the area specified in column 2 of the said Table opposite the name of

the kind of plant concerned to any land within the area specified in column 3 of the said Table opposite the name of the kind of plant concerned.

Prohibition relating to keeping, planting or cultivation of certain controlled goods

- 5. (1) No person shall keep, plant, cultivate or remove any controlled goods imported or removed in contravention of the provisions of section 3 of the Act or in contravention of a condition set out in the permit referred to in section 3 (1) of the Act, or any controlled goods obtained or derived there from, or descended or produced by, from or by means thereof, whatever the connection or degree of descent or relationship, in the Republic.
- (2) A person in possession of any controlled goods of which the importation may not be authorised under section 3(6) of the Act shall-
 - (a) not keep in his possession or distribute such goods; and
 - (b) immediately destroy such goods, or otherwise dispose thereof in the manner determined by the Executive Officer.

Application for permits

6. (1) An application for a permit which may be issued by the executive officer under a control measure in order to exempt a user of land from the prohibition or obligation contained in such control measure shall be made on a form which is obtainable from the executive officer for this purpose.

- (2) Such application form shall-
 - (a) be completed by the user of land requiring such permit;
 - (b) after having been thus completed, be submitted to the executive officer; and

(c) be thus submitted so as to reach the executive officer at least 30 days prior to the date on which such permit will be required.

Compulsory notification

- 7. (1) Every user of land within the Republic shall immediately notify the executive officer of any occurrence or suspected occurrence of any pest specified in these Control Measures, in any pest free area.
 - (2) Any individual or organization or institution that has for the first time identified or recorded a new pest to be present in the Republic, shall immediately report it to the executive officer.
 - (3) Upon national pest reporting, the executive officer shall immediately undertake necessary phytosanitary procedures to prevent the establishment and further spread of prohibited pest/s.

Destruction of plants, plant products and other regulated articles

- 8. (1) If the executive officer has suspected on reasonable grounds or established that plants, plant products and other regulated articles have been kept or cultivated, removed or conveyed contrary to the provisions of these Control Measures, may-
 - (a) destroy such plants, plant products and other regulated articles;
 - (b) order that such products in question are sent back to a specified quarantine area;

(c) subject a person in question to an offence in terms of section 13 of this Act.

(2) If the executive officer has identified and/or confirmed or suspected occurrence of a regulated pest or any pest specified in these Control Measures in a pest free area, place of production or production site, may-

(a) destroy infested or infected plants, plant products and other regulated articles;

(b) order that infested or infected plants, plant products and other regulated articles be destroyed.
