	If no, describe, whenever possible, how and why it deviates from the international standard: Deviations may occur because South African Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) related to, among others, field trials conducted in this country, are used in the estimation of MRLs. In addition, exposure assessments of pesticides are conducted

using South African consumption data rather than GEMS regional consumption data of the FAO/WHO.

The original regulation, however, indicates that where food is imported into South Africa, and if the MRLs are more restrictive than Codex MRLs, Codex MRLs will be accepted providing that exposure to the population is not a risk to human safety.
