6. Description of content: MPI is proposing to amend the Import Health Standard. This notification relates to the proposal to amend the Import Health Standard: <i>Grain and seeds for consumption, feed or processing</i> . The amendment includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- removing specific pests from millet (<i>Panicum</i> spp.) pest list, along with the specific import requirements for those pests in millet seeds; and- adding phytosanitary requirements for the import of canola seeds (<i>Brassica napus</i>) and green millet (<i>Pennisetum glaucum</i> and <i>P. clandestinum</i>).
