Recently a large amount of information has become available, particularly from the European Food Safety Authority on the use of antibiotic resistance markers and this was incorporated into the document. (iii) The document is seventy percent to completion and the comments of the Advisory Committee is currently also being worked into it. (iv) The Council noted that DEAT will present the document to Council members as soon as possible before the meeting of 17 July 2007 and if need be, the Council will then refer it back to the Advisory Committee with specific questions.
